# MINUTES OF REGULAR CALLED MEETING August 13, 2024

# Call to Order, Proof of Posting, Proof of Notification

### I. PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Alderman opened the Public Hearing for any discussion on the 2024-2025 Proposed Budget and 2024 Tax Rate for the City of Hubbard. With no visitors and comments the Public Hearing was closed.

## II. AGENDA ITEMS

A. Ordinance No 082024-46 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 13, SECTION 13.02.003 RATES AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE FEE SCHEDULE FOUND IN APPENDIX A ARTICLE A6.000 UTILITY RELATED FEES OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HUBBARD, TEXAS, ENTITLED SECTION A6.003 WATER RATES AND A6.006 SEWER RATES FOR ALL PERSONS SUPPLIED WITH WATER AND SEWER SERVICES. THIS ORDINANCE IS TO TAKE EFFECT ON THE OCTOBER BILLING CYCLE OF 2024 WHICH IS PAID IN NOVEMBER OF 2024.

Simone Johnson made the motion to approve Ordinance No. 082024 – An Ordinance amending Chapter 13, Section 13.02.003 rates as provided for in the fee schedule found in Appendix A Article A6.00 Utility related fees of the Code of Ordinance of the City of Hubbard, Texas, entitled Section A6.003 Water Rates and A6.006 Sewer Rates for all persons supplied with water and sewer services. Ordinance is to take effect on the October billing cycle of 2024 which is paid in November of 2024; seconded by Roger Lynch. The vote was 5 to 0. Motion carried.

## B. 2024-2025 Proposed Budget.

# C. 2024 Proposed Tax Rate.

D. Review, Consider and Act on Final Plat submitted by Marvin Willie Hawkins, Jr. depicting the proposed plan to replat Lot 9, Block 75, Original Town of Hubbard Addition of the City of Hubbard Hill County, Texas being Lot 1, the North 120 feet of Lot 2 and the North 160 feet of Lot

3, Block 75 as per plat recorded in Volume 516, Page 788 of the Deed Records of Hill County. It is entitled to approval only, if in accordance with local plans, ordinances and conditions placed on said property.

Wayne Taylor made the motion to table this item due to Mr. Hawkins not available for questions; seconded by Kenneth Baldwin. Wayne Taylor, Kenneth Baldwin, Roger Lynch and Simone Johnson voted aye. Brandon Ivy voted nay. Motion carried.

H. July 2024 financials.

Police Department received 169 calls for service; 3 warrant arrests; 244 violations and applied for Dorothy Gaines Foundation for a side-by-side to be utilized in a variety different fields including events, parades and active investigations.
